Fond du Lac is looking for a product that will manage print, scheduling and filtering.

Menasha is interested in the print management module for Pharos.

Overdrive Downloadable Audio

What's the status of marketing for overdrive? Initially we were asked to hold off on marketing/advertising this product/service because of the limited number of titles available. Is there something available to us now that the collection has grown?

Has there been any progress allowing downloads to iPods?
