Pros


- Simple, streamlined and easier to use

- Download for offline use
- More customizable view of collection
- Holds have expected wait time (also a con!)

Cons


- Not compatible with Kindle tablets or videos
- No recommend titles option
- Not able to create wishlists
- No sharing titles

For new holds, you will receive a courtesy email to this address when the hold is ready to borrow. If you are under 13 years old, enter the email address of your parent or guardian.

BORROW HOLDS AUTOMATICALLY

When a hold becomes available, it will be borrowed for you automatically, as long as you are not at your loans limit for that library card.

HOLD STATE

You can suspend holds when you have too much to read, or too little time. Your hold will progress while suspended. Other people move ahead of you only when you're at the front of the queue.

All of your existing holds have these settings.
